Results of the election

In November 2020, the entire world was turned towards the United States for the presidential elections. Finally, the winner of this election is Joe Biden, Barack Obama's vice-president from 2009 to 2017, a democrat. He faced Donald Trump, the actual president from the Republicans' party. He will govern with his running-mate named Kamala Harris, who will be the first woman Afro-American to be appointed to such a position.

Striking information :

During studying this topic, I learnt a lot of pieces of striking information. For example, I was shocked to discover that during primaries, Kamala Harris took on Joe Biden. However, he still chose to be his running mate to face Donald Trump for the presidency. Indeed, he considers she can be his Trump card. Moreover, I was really surprised to learn that in USA, the election process is very complicated because when you are an American, you don't vote directly for the person you want to elect but for an Electoral College instead. This system is not fair because one vote doesn't equal one citizen.




